THE WDB INNOVATION FUND PROPOSED FUNDING OF \$150K FOR BIOPHARMACEUTICAL MANUFACTURING PRE-APPRENTICESHIP/APPRENTICESHIP PILOT PROJECT

EDD CONSTRUCTION PRE-APPRENTICESHIP PIPELINE FOR RE-ENTRY - PILOT PROJECT GRANT

Summary: This item presents for information and discussion, and any other action deemed necessary, a presentation of the objective to launch the EDD Construction Pre-Apprenticeship Pipeline for Re-Entry - Pilot Project Grant in the amount of \$250,000 (100% match requirement) with Grant Term of June 1, 2018 - December 30, 2019. This project is intended to align local building trades councils and trades' joint apprenticeship programs with California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), both inside the wall and post-release (including transition centers). Effectively creating a pipeline for parolees from prison to state-approved construction apprenticeship programs. Main objective is reducing the time it takes for parolees to become apprentices.
